ORDINANCE NO. 002-2003

AN ORDINANCE GIVING INCENTIVE / AWARD TO
OUTSTANDING ENTREPINYOY OF LA UNION

Introduced by: Sangguniang Panlalawigan Member Reynaldo V. Dulay

Be it enacted by the Sangguniang Panlalawigan in session duly assembled:

SECTION 1. TITLE. – This ordinance shall be known and cited as “**OUTSTANDING PROVINCIAL ENTREPINYOY AWARD**”.

SECTION 2. DECLARATION OF POLICY. – It is hereby declared the policy of the Provincial Government of La Union to give recognition to businessmen whose leadership, dynamism and professionalism fulfill social responsibilities and profound impact in our people demonstrated by:

- a. continued and sustained efforts to promote more jobs / employment in the province;
- b. made remarkable investments in La Union;
- c. able to produce quality goods and / or services; and
- d. bringing honor and prestige to the province of La Union.

This Award is also meant to provide inspiration to other entrepreneurs in the hope that by example more entrepreneurs may be encouraged to invest in the province.

SECTION 3. DEFINITION OF TERMS. – The following definition of terms shall be construed to mean only as defined by this Ordinance:

- a. **ENTREPINOY** – shall mean individual, partnership, corporation and other entity incorporated and / or organized and existing under Philippine Laws and operating within the territorial jurisdiction of the province of La Union.
- b. **MANUFACTURING** – shall mean a duly registered business entity with the SEC and / or DTI located within the province whose principal business activity is the production or manufacturing of furnitures, antique furnitures, loom weaving, gifts, toys and housewares, food processing, metals and engineering works, cutflowers and ornamental plants and pebbles.
- c. **SERVICE** – shall mean establishment or entity whose principal function is to serve directly the public such as, but not limited to, transportation, hotel, food outlets (fast foods / restaurants) and banking institutions.
- d. **TRADING** – shall refer to all trading activities whose principal or main location of business is within the territorial jurisdiction of the province.
- e. **LA UNION INVESTMENT BOARD** – shall mean the Board created under Provincial Ordinance No. 005-99, entitled: An Ordinance enacting the La Union Investment Incentive Code of 1999, composed of the following:

SECTION 4. AWARD CATEGORIES.

- 1. Young Outstanding Entrepinoy – This category is:
 - a) open to young entrepreneurs from age 18 – 25 yrs. old
 - b) with assets of P500,000.00 to P1.5 M

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2. Most Outstanding La Union Entrepinoy Investor (MOLE Investor). This category is open to all enterprises with assets not more than P15 Million.
3. Most Outstanding La Union Entrepinoy Sector Leader (MOLE Sector Leader). This category is open to all enterprises with assets from P 1.5 Million to P 15 Million. This category shall have the following sub - categories:
 - a. Manufacturing
 - a.1. Furniture or Antique Furniture
 - a.2. Cutflowers and Ornamental plants
 - a.3. Loomweaving
 - a.4. Gift, toys and housewares
 - a.5. Pebbles
 - a.6. Food processing
 - a.7. Metals and engineering works
 - b. Services
 - b.1. Transportation
 - b.2. Hotels
 - b.3. Food outlets (fastfoods / restaurants)
 - b.4. Banking Institutions
 - c. Trading - all trading activities

SECTION 5. CRITERIA OF THE AWARD.

- 5.1. Most Outstanding La Union Entrepinoy Investor Category (MOLE Investor Category)

Under this category, the Investor/s must have exemplified the following:

- a.a. Leadership and dynamism as evidenced by the actual accomplishments generated by investments in the following areas:
 - a.1. Employment generation of local residents as evidenced by the number of new jobs deriving from the investment projects; generation of employment and / or establishing network or linkages with other enterprises;
 - a.2. Human resources development as evidenced by the opportunities and training and welfare programs it gives to its employees for personal and career advancement and self-development as a total human-being;
 - a.3. The amount of individual investment in the enterprise.
- a.b. Utilization of indigenous raw material/s and / or services.
- a.c. Capital or physical risk based on the nature of the investment and / or geographical location.
- a.d. Goodwill the business has contributed to the province.
- a.e. Environmental friendly

- 5.2. Most Outstanding La Union Entrepinoy Sector Leader (MOLE Sector Leader)

- a. Years of business existence.
- b. Utilization of indigenous raw materials and / or service
- c. Asset size, employment size
- d. Amount of Sales / Receipts
- e. Innovations introduced that contributed to the growth of the industry sector
- f. Goodwill it has earned for the good of the province.

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SECTION 6. QUALIFICATIONS. – Nominee for this Award must be:

- 6.1. A registered enterprise operating in the province of La Union which has been in existence for at least three (3) years.
- 6.2. For the MOLE – Sector Leader category, it must belong to one of the sub-categories

SECTION 7. NOMINATION REQUIREMENTS.

- 7.1. Nominees in both categories shall submit a copy of their business name registration certificate / Income Tax Return (ITR) for past three (3) years.
- 7.2. Nominees shall submit a company profile and a brief report of their accomplishments for the past three (3) years.
- 7.3. All nominees should be endorsed by the City/Municipal Mayor of the town where the business is located.
- 7.4. Nominations for both categories must be forwarded to the Committee on Trade and Industry of the Sangguniang Panlalawigan
- 7.5. Duly accomplished nomination form

SECTION 8. NUMBER OF NOMINEES. - Nominations shall be limited, per municipality, to:

- a. Three (3) nominations for the MOLE Investor category;
- b. Three (3) nominations for each sub-category in the MOLE Sector Leader category.

SECTION 9. SELECTION COMMITTEE. - The selection of Provincial Winners shall be conducted by the La Union Investment Board as provided under Provincial Ordinance 005-99.

SECTION 10. STATE AND DEADLINE OF NOMINATION AND DATE OF AWARDING.

1. The nomination shall start on the first week of October 1, 2003 and every year thereafter.
2. The deadline of filing of nomination shall be on or before November 30, 2003.
3. Awarding of winners shall be held during the Foundation Anniversary of the Province of La Union – March 2, 2004 and every year thereafter with Trade and Industry Month.

SECTION 11. PRIZES OF WINNERS. – Each winner shall be awarded a Provincial Trophy and cash prize as follows:

- a. For Most Outstanding La Union Entrepinoy Investor
 - First Prize - Trophy / Plaque
 - Second Prize - Trophy / Plaque
 - Third Prize - Trophy / Plaque
- b. Young Outstanding Entrepreneur – 18- 25 yrs. old –assets- P10,000.00 + Trophy
- c. For Most Outstanding La Union Entrepinoy Sector Leader - Trophy
 - One winner only for each sub-category: P5,000.00
 - b.1. Manufacturing
 - Antique Furniture - P 5,000.00
 - Cutflowers & Ornamental plants - 5,000.00
 - Loomweaving 5,000.00

APPROPRIATION. – The amount of P 125,000.00 is hereby appropriated from the Economic Development Fund of the province or from any applicable appropriation for the implementation of this ordinance. Any amount thereafter, necessary to carry out the implementation of this ordinance shall be appropriated as the need




SECTION 14. EFFECTIVITY. – This Ordinance shall take effect in accordance with provisions of the Local Government Code of 1991.






